



AUDITION PREP

Welcome to our Audition Prep class!

This class is designed to help your child feel more confident in their next audition!

We will treat this class as we do for audition with three sections. Dance—Vocal –Acting

Students will receive feedback on how to improve their audition in each area.

Please arrive in clothing that you can move in. Jazz shoes are preferred, but socks work too!

Dance:

Students will be taught a combination in class. Nothing needs to be prepared for this at home.

Vocal:

Students will need to come prepared to sing the song on the following page. For this audition, everyone will sing the same thing. We will go over the song briefly in class, but going over it ahead of time is ideal. If you can memorize it, even better!

Acting:

Students will need to come prepared with one of the following monologue options. These should be memorized if possible.

Please remind your student that this is their time to practice and receive feedback. There will also be a time to ask questions about auditioning—so if you have any, please come prepared to ask them!

Auditioning is scary no matter how old you get—practicing is a great way to learn how to calm your nerves!

Students will come home with a sheet on what they should work and focus on for their next audition.


